You are likely well aware that everything upon the web is not to be believed. You as well are probably well aware that there are all types of survey scams spread out right across the internet. But are you familiar with any of the most common scams that catch people all the time. Here are four types of survey scams to be vigilant of.

1. Small fee for huge payouts

There are an amount of survey programs that claim you will be able to earn a six-figure income merely by completing surveys online. All it costs you is a small fee that tends to range from \$10 to \$50. What makes this a type of survey a scam is that you will not find a program out there that you can legitimately earn six-figures from. Although several programs are good for picking up more money on the side, do not expect to get wealthy off of it.

2. Giving out your mobile phone number

Exactly like with telemarketers, you never want to give out your mobile phone number to programs you don't trust. You should never have to confirm a membership by giving the company your mobile phone number. Since they are an internet-oriented program, you should be able to confirm your membership by replying through your e-mail. What will wind up taking place is you'll receive telephone calls that cost you up to \$6 a call and a lot of text messages with special offers.

3. Telephone bill type survey cons

Very much the same as handing out your mobile phone number, be careful when giving out your name and address as well. By handing out your phone number and additional personal information you'll be able to fill out a survey. From there, you will be given the choice to obtain a free issue for a magazine subscription. It appears harmless, but having got your information allows them to tack on a monthly or annual bill for the subscription onto your phone bill. And what is disturbing is that very few people notice the small \$10 fee added on.

4. Multiple offer screens

Everybody has received this at some point in time regardless of whether you have filled out a survey before. Simply these are among the most common type survey cons on the web. You will be filling out a survey and when you finish it, you will be directed to a different web site offering you a special deal. The trick is that clicking no will just direct you to some other "amazing offer" that you can't refuse. After a long time, you might finally click yes to one of the offers merely to finish the survey. A few offers will not cost you money, but you can expect to receive a plethora of phone calls from telemarketers who know you are "now interested."
