If each install creator for each system be it Linux, Windows XP, Mac OS or some other system was developed separately, it would require quality assurance, i.e. extra time in production and testing to assure a satisfactory experience to users. The good news is, though, that you there exist a number of cross-system software installer programs. Java specialists who prefer open source projects may go for Java install creator IzPack.. Talking of installers, it would be wrong not to mention their cousins, that is uninstallers. In the past some solutions contained no uninstallers, so some third-party uninstallers were to be used. Nevertheless, nowadays the majority of software applications have more or less adequate uninstallers, therefore you do not have to think a lot about obtaining a different program to erase things off your system. Still those 3rd party uninstallers are used today. Many programs have features that are not erased by the built-in uninstall solution. Trojan and spyware programs pose one more challenge to your system. Such a solution will not erase itself voluntarily, so a bit of assistance from a specialized uninstaller may be required. Uninstallers usually have some extra functionality such as handing cache memory and managing temporary files, and so on. Life is short. Install more.
